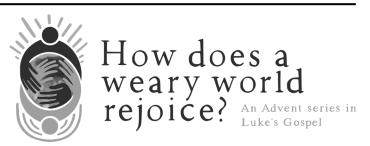
Updating our Online Directory

"How does a weary world rejoice? This is a difficult question to image, much less to answer. The world was the first tangible image that emerged from our brainstorming. This theme feels all-encompassing; it feels important to highlight its expansiveness with a visual reference to the globe. The other design problem to solve was how to reference both weariness and joy. How do you visually hold these contrasting emotions together? What feels connective about these emotions is that they are very human. We decided on the image of a comforting embrace, and perhaps in the space between the people, continents and bodies of water come into view. These two people could represent characters we follow this Advent season: Elizabeth & Zechariah, Mary & Elizabeth, Mary & Joseph. Or maybe the figures are more broadly representative of God & humanity or of the personification of joy & weariness. Two people one radiating joy and the other wading into weariness— hold the world together."

As we head into the upcoming holiday season, we are grateful for God's many blessings in our lives. While food is often a large part of our holiday celebrations, for those experiencing food insecurity, this isn't always the case.

At Fairmount Avenue United Methodist Church, we have the opportunity to share what we have been given with our neighbors. At the beginning of each month, usually the first Sunday, we can make a difference by participating the First Fruits Collection. Nonperishable food, non-food items (diapers, toiletries, cleaning supplies, paper goods, etc.) as well as checks made out to Keystone Community Services are collected by our children during worship. All donations are then delivered by Fairmount volunteers during the following week to Keystone (1916 University Avenue, St. Paul.) We are grateful to all who felt called to donate items in October and to Steve Wertz, who delivered 47 pounds to Keystone!

We hope that you will consider being a Keystone volunteer. Presently, we have slots open for December through June of next year. There are also opportunities to volunteer directly at Keystone helping stock shelves or guiding guests as they choose needed items. 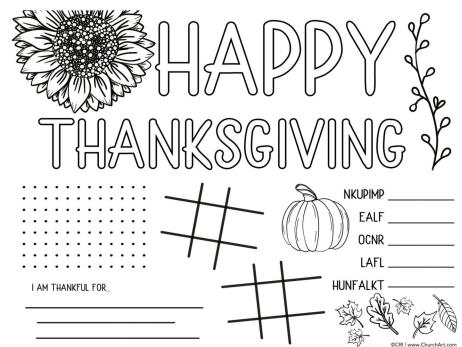

Cindy's Corner

Reflection Topic: Taking a Breath/Pause

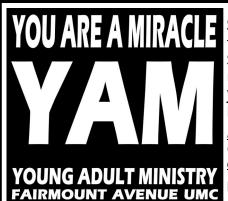
As we have been learning in Sunday Faith Formation and Exploration, a word for the Holy Spirit is pneuma/breath/wind. In Genesis 1, a "wind" from God swept over the waters on the first day of creation; God breathed into Adam's nostrils the breath of life. One can search for all references, but to jump to our studies in Acts 2, "a rush of violent wind" brought the flames of the Spirit to the disciples gathered. Here are some ideas on how to ground, pause with the breath, to tap into God and listen.

- 1) Breath prayer. Take a Bible verse or phrase-- say half breathing in and half breathing out.
- 2) Take a Psalm or poem-- read a verse, then sit with it, meditating on a word/image/focus that spoke to you. Then, continue on with this for a few more verses.
- 3) Meditate on a picture.

Above all, rest in God's light and love that is already in each one of us, listening for the Holy Spirit to guide and heal. Blessings,

We are offering a **by-stander CPR training session** on Wednesday, November 1 starting at 6:30pm. It will consist of a video and CPR practice on mannequins. We will not be doing mouth to mouth.

Loneliness has always affected people and it seems more so in the past few years. One good outcome of the pandemic is that people are more open about it and it is less stigmatized.

An article in a Blue Zones (www.bluezones.com) email on October 5 included an article by Mo Perry on "Why Social Bonds are So Important For Our Health." This includes quotes from Kory Floyd, PhD; Stephanie Cacioppo, PhD; Julianne Holt-Lunstad, PhD. Loneliness is the feeling of being isolated. It is defined as a gap between one's actual and ideal levels of social connection. It is a signal we are not getting the social connections we need. We can experience loneliness even when surrounded by people. Also, a person can be alone and not feel lonely. Everyone feels lonely at times, but is a problem when it produces a lot of negative thinking. A lonely person may develop a sense of hypervigilance combined

with a tendency to misinterpret social signals and feel that people are not accepting them.

Holt-Lanstad states that loneliness can increase the odds of early death by 26%. It can affect our immune system and susceptibility to viruses, and impede our ability to heal from an infection.

The good news is that we can change this. What are good social connections may vary from person to person. Some people may need the assistance of a therapist.

Cacioppo has developed a set of strategies to help us overcome fear and consciously enhance our sense of connection. By the use of the acronym: **GRACE**.

G = Gratitude. Write down 5 things that you truly appreciate every day. Your mind is your main social organ. You can choose to feel lonely or grateful.

R = Reciprocity. We need to receive care, but also to give back in order to have a sense of worth. Feeling useful is needed to erase feelings of loneliness. Do a small act of kindness for your neighbor.

A = Altruism. Generously offering your time and resources helps dispel the self- focused rumination that is the hallmark of a lonely mind (Floyd). It is about sharing, not just money—but life experiences, wisdom and direct assistance. Volunteering can be a great way to enhance feelings of connection.

C = Choice. We have some choice about the way we feel. We don't feel guilty about being thirsty, but if we don't take a drink—that is our choice. We can chose to work towards a positive mindset. We can control what is controllable.

E = Enjoyment. We can all use a little fun in life. It takes 3 pieces of positive stress to counteract 2 negative ones. Every positive experience we share with those around us, improves our wellbeing and those around us.

One of the most important things we can do is reach out. In person and online is better than digital at alleviating loneliness.

Thanksgiving is a special time to practice GRACE. It is a time to think of all the ways God is good to us. It is a time to care for your neighbor. If they have no where to go, invite them for dinner. We can volunteer to help with the Simpson Meal or one at Project home. Remember it is our choice in how we spend our time and resources. Let us do it with our neighbor in mind. And enjoy what you are doing. Maybe share a joke, go for a walk with someone, attend an event For Jesus' thoughts on being a neighbor-Think of the story of the Good Samaritan, Luke 19:25-37.
