Fall Music Makers

All Explorers are also invited to join the Music Makers fall program, held at Fairmount Avenue UMC on Thursday evenings (time TBD). The fall program will have 10 sessions: October 5, 12, 19; November 2, 9, 16, 30; December 7, 14, 21.

Designed to introduce children to the joys and foundational skills of music, classes will prepare kids to become musical in 3 ways:

- 1. **Tuneful** to have tunes in their heads and learn to coordinate their voices to sing those tunes.
- Beatful to feel the pulse of music and how that pulse is grouped in either 2s or 3s.
- 3. **Artful** to be moved by music in the many ways music can elicit a feelingful response.

Classes will be taught by our very own Mindy Way-Johnson, a musician with more than 35 years of teaching experience in public and private schools, church music programs, and private music studios. She has taught musicians from toddlers to seniors. Mindy has also served as organist, choir director and handbell choir director in several churches. In addition to her bachelor's degree in music education, she holds a Master of Sacred Music from Luther Seminary, and has received training in Kindermusik, MusikGarten, Orff, Kodaly and the Feierabend curriculum for young children.




Followers "Late-Over"

The American Lung Association (www.lung.org) has a lot of information on lung health. Here are some thoughts.

Our lungs are vital to our lives but we rarely are aware of them unless we have a problem. The average lung capacity is about 6 liters of air. The lungs reach full maturity around about age 20–25 and then at age 35 the lung function begins to decline gradually. If your notice any great changes, you should see your doctor. The body does have some defenses to keep dirt and germs out of our lungs, but it's important that we also prioritize our lung health.

Signs and symptoms indicating the need to contact your doctor are: Chronic cough, shortness of breath, chronic mucus production (sputum or phlegm) for a month or longer, wheezing, or coughing up blood.

The best way to take care of your lungs is to NOT smoke.
This is the major cause of lung cancer and COPD which includes chronic bronchitis and emphysema. It narrows the air passages making breathing more difficult, causes chronic inflammation or swelling, and over time it destroys lung tissue.
Secondly, avoid air pollutants.

We tend to spend 90% of our time indoors, especially in the winter. Things to be aware of are secondhand smoke (if someone smokes they should always do it completely outdoors- no standing in the doorway and blowing out), have adequate ventilation when using chemicals (use household, hobby products, and cleaning products that are less toxic), mediate mold and mildew-run a dehumidifier to keep humidity level under 50% (be sure to clean it regularly), seal leaks, fix drips, test for radon, put away food and cover trash, eliminate mice and cockroaches by using bait, avoid burning wood inside, don't use scented candles or fragrances to hide odors, don't store hazardous chemicals in the home, plan ahead to protect indoor air from wildfire smoke. Other things you can do are

exercise (if the outdoor air quality is poor, exercise indoors). Also, avoid exercising in high traffic areas. Your can check the air quality at www.airnow.gov. Keep up-to-date with your

immunizations— influenza, RSV, COVID-19, Pertussis (whooping cough), and pneumonia— all help protect your lungs.

Genesis 2:7 "The Lord formed the man from dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life and the man became a living being." Just as God provided breath for the first man, Adam, God also provides us with breath. Let us take good care of our lungs so we can use them to give God praise.

Psalm 150:6 "Let everything that has breath praise the lord." We often use the term Breath of Life to refer to something that is essential to our life. Breathing in oxygen and out carbon dioxide is essential for us to live physically, but the breath of the Holy Spirit is essential for our spiritual life. Let us maintain our spiritual body so that it can receive this Breath.

John 20:22 "Jesus said, 'Peace be with you as the Father has sent me, I am sending you.' And with that he breathed on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.'"
