Adult Sunday School

"The Gift and Power of Story" Throughout history, stories have been used to entertain, teach and help listeners understand even the most abstract concepts. Stories told well can make ideas more accessible and memorable. Jesus was a skillful storyteller and shared countless powerful messages through parables recorded in the scriptures. Join in this 4-week series held at 9:00am Sunday mornings starting September 17 to explore the gift and power of stories that help us better understand how to apply this divine guidance in today's world.

This series will be facilitated by Amy Dauplaise, long-time member of FAUMC. Amy received her Master of Arts in Theology and the Arts in 2017 from United Theological Seminary (UTS) and will be returning to UTS this Fall to pursue studies in Spiritual Direction.

Missional Goals Update— In the fall of 2022, Church Council lay leaders and staff met to begin discerning missional goals for the next year and next five years. In May, we passed one year and five year missional goals and have now begun the process of strategic planning to support these goals. We have set our vision on being an invitational community that welcomes people from various parts of our community and establishing partnerships with local organizations as we think about how our building can be used as a gathering space for more than just our purposes. Below is a preview of our missional goals for the next year and five years.

<u>Wesleyan Connections</u>: The General Rules ask us to 1. Do no harm. 2. Do good. 3. Attend to the ordinances of God. <u>Scripture Connections</u>: Mark 2:13-17 (Jesus calls Matthew, a tax collector and sinner), Micah 6:8, Acts 8:26-40 (Philip and the Eunuch), Matthew 19:14 (let children come), Matthew 26:17-30 (last supper), Matthew 2:1-12 (Wedding at Cana)

One-Year Missional Goals: Building on-ramps to a more invitational community

<u>Signage</u>. Install fresh signage inside and outside the building to make spaces and access more visitor-friendly. <u>Meet-ups</u>. Establish meet-ups to create opportunities for social connection within the congregation at breweries, parks, coffee shops, concerts, etc. These activities would be hosted so someone from the church is available to greet and make connections for newish people at meet-ups. Newish people are repeat visitors who have not yet made a formal membership commitment to our congregation.

Build and train for invitational ministries. Discern, create and implement invitational ministries to expand our greeters' ministry, train the entire congregation to be thoughtfully welcoming and invitational to visitors, establish on-ramps or an intentional process to invite visitors into the community to build connections and relationships beginning with the first visit. It is our intention to use worship, video and small group training to build this spirit of invitation in our congregation. Space planning. Start space planning and work with experts to discern possibilities for kitchen and lower-level renovations, including an audit of how to make our building more accessible for people with special needs.

Partnerships. Explore potential partnerships with Interfaith Action of Greater St. Paul and Emma Norton Services as priority local ministries, as well as potential program partners from community research initiatives.

Funding. Make a plan for undesignated funds to help Fairmount Avenue UMC achieve its one-year and five-year goals, discerning how the funds might support these goals with an eye towards the future of Fairmount's faith community.

Five-Year Missional goals: Becoming a more invitational community

<u>Center of Community Connection</u>. Establish our building as a Center of Community Connection (a community hub or hearth) by inviting outside groups and organizations to use our space as a place to gather, inspire and promote goodness for our larger community. We envision:

- Partnering with organizations that align with our values as a church and create space for people to engage in spiritual exploration, life-skill growth, creative pursuits, justice and compassion programs, and healing and wellness.
- Inviting participants in these groups to engage in the larger work of the church by encouraging collaboration where appropriate, using signage in the building to tell our shared story and highlight our initiatives.
- Having established partnerships with community organizations that grew out of our community research.

<u>New community ministries</u>. Create ministry initiatives that specifically meet the needs of a growing retired community, a growing professional young adult community, and growing families with young children in our neighborhood. <u>Revamp spaces</u>. Remodel lower-level kitchen and fellowship hall to enable more invitational ministry and create plans for updates and accessibility in lower-level spaces that have not yet been remodeled.

<u>Measure our impact</u>. Establish a system to track, recognize and celebrate the good being done in the community through our congregation and community partners, the use of our building and the actions of our members.

All Explorers are also invited to join the Music Makers fall program, held at Fairmount Avenue UMC on Thursday evenings (time TBD).



The fall program will have 10 sessions: October 5, 12, 19; November 2, 9, 16, 30; December 7, 14, 21.

Designed to introduce children to the joys and foundational skills of music, classes will prepare kids to become musical in 3 ways:

- Tuneful to have tunes in their heads and learn to coordinate their voices to sing those tunes.
- Beatful to feel the pulse of music and how that pulse is grouped in either 2s or 3s.
- 3. **Artful** to be moved by music in the many ways music can elicit a feelingful response.

Classes will be taught by our very own Mindy Way-Johnson, a musician with more than 35 years of teaching experience in public and private schools, church music programs, and private music studios. She has taught musicians from toddlers to seniors. Mindy has also served as organist, choir director and handbell choir director in several churches. In addition to her bachelor's degree in music education, she holds a Master of Sacred Music from Luther Seminary, and has received training in Kindermusik, MusikGarten, Orff, Kodaly and the Feierabend curriculum for young children.

Reflection Topic: Road Maps



Food Security Ministries

First Fruits

First Fruits is a vital and ongoing ministry here at Fairmount Avenue United Methodist Church. We continue to see inflation in nearly every aspect of our lives. Individuals experiencing food insecurity are often impacted the most. Food shelves such as those run by Keystone Community Services are a lifeline for many of our Twin City neighbors.

At the beginning of each month, usually on the first Sunday, we can help to make a difference in the lives of those experiencing food insecurity by participating in the First Fruits collection. Non-perishable food, non-food items (diapers, toiletries, cleaning supplies, paper goods etc.) as well as checks made out to Keystone are collected by our children during worship. These contributions are then delivered to Keystone (1916 University Avenue, St. Paul) by Fairmount volunteers during the following week. Thank you to Steve Wertz, who delivered 97 items (no scale available) in June, 22lbs in July and 67lbs in August!

Blood Pressure checks will be offered in the Susanna Room from 9:30–10:00am and following worship on **Sunday, September 3**.

Our annual fall **Flu Shot Clinic** will be **Wednesday, October 11** from 5:00–7:00pm. A Sign Up Genius form will be available later this month. The vaccinations will be provided by St. Paul Corner Drug.

The Health Team is working on getting **information to update the online directory**. Please expect a phone call or email regarding this.

Our **AED unit** is located in the hall outside the Wesley Room across from the mailboxes. It is useful in restarting the heart in times of certain irregular heart beats. The AED will tell the rescuer whether a shock is indicated or not.

A **sudden cardiac arrest** causes all heart activity to ceases due to an irregular heart rhythm. There is sudden collapse, breathing also stops and the person becomes unconscious. Without immediate treatment, death will occur in a matter of minutes.

Heart attack occurs when the blood flow to a part of the heart is blocked. This can change the heart's electrical activity and lead to sudden cardiac arrest.

Survival is possible with the use of immediate emergency treatment which consists of CPR, shock with an AED, as well as calling 911. Further medical treatment may consist of medications and/or surgery.

Warning symptoms may occur beforehand. These may be chest

discomfort or pain, shortness of breath, weakness, fast pulse or palpitations (fluttering or pounding heart), light headedness, dizziness, fainting or near fainting. If these symptoms are not normal for you, **do not** wait, call 911.

Risk factors include a family history of coronary artery disease which you cannot change and diabetes (for which the onset of type 2 can be delayed with lifestyle changes). Modifiable factors include smoking, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, obesity, and an inactive lifestyle.

So, the **things you can do** are eat healthy (a Mediterranean diet or DASH diet), have regular check-ups, do not smoke, NO use of tobacco, control blood pressure and cholesterol, maintain a healthy weight, regular exercise (150 minutes or more per week), and manage stress. No alcohol use is best. If you do drink, do so in moderation which is no more than 1 drink/day for women and men over age 65 and no more than 2 drinks/day for young men.



The Health Team is organizing a **Bystander CPR class** to be held Wednesday, November 1. Watch for further information.

Along with caring for our physical heart, it is necessary to care for our spiritual heart. One will affect the other. Proverbs 14:30a "A heart at peace gives life to the body." Where and how can we have this peace?

Psalms 56:4a tells us "In God, whose word I praise, in God I **trust**, I will not be afraid." Trust in the Lord who is always with you and cares for you.

When we pray the Lord's Prayer, we ask God to **forgive** us as we forgive others. We may need God's help in being able to forgive others.
